About the project

"EffecTive" is a Horizon Europe implemented project international consortium of universities and education-related stakeholders. Its goal is to enhance teachers' pedagogical competence (PDC), a competence crucial in navigating the digital landscape of modern classrooms impact student and able to by outcomes, fostering cooperation between policymakers and teacher training institutions.

The EffecTive project focuses on primary and secondary school teachers, assessing needs and evaluating selected PDC training policies through 12 interventions across 5 countries. The collected data will provide insights into the efficiency and cost-effectiveness of the current distribution of public resources for professional development.



A quick update!

The implementation of the EffecTive activities is running smoothly in these months.

In WP1 Deliverable 1.2 has been finalized and submitted. In the meantime, the preparation of Deliverable 1.3, a literature review on pedagogical approaches in technology-enriched classrooms that have been shown to influence the development and effectiveness of students' SRL skills, is underway.

In WP2, where we are designing effective teacher training interventions for the development of PDC (pedagogical digital competence), we are getting ready to submit our first Deliverable to the European Commission.

In WP3, while we are finalizing the first deliverable, we are also evaluating the pilot phase to make final decisions for the intervention phase and conclude the instruments for student level questionnaire.

In WP4 we developed our initial cost-benefit framework for teacher training interventions. It includes teacher training programme elements, costs, benefits, and background variables, addressing the lack of existing evaluations for digital teaching and learning policies.



A glance at our Deliverables

What we have developed and released so far...

During the first project year, the EffecTive Consortium developed and released the first project deliverables.

First, a series of **transversal outputs** were released, related to project management and dissemination and promotion of the project, useful for guiding the consortium in the implementation of the activities. Furthermore, the partners also developed **specific results** such as:

- Report on the overarching theoretical and political framing of EffecTive (D1.1), which contains (1) an overall view on the PDC national and local policy programs and educational policy contexts in Estonia, Finland, Austria, Germany, and Israel, (2) the project theoretical foundation of teacher and student competencies and skills, and (3) a preliminary analysis of the existing empirical research where we identify the main elements of effective teacher training interventions.
- Initial Cost-benefit framework (D4.1), which represents an initial cost-benefit framework for teacher training interventions to guide future decision-making regarding PDC training.
- Evidence-based principles for effective teacher training of PDC (D1.2), an umbrella
 review offering a comprehensive analysis of effective design elements in teacher
 training interventions. It explores their impact on teachers' pedagogical digital
 competencies (PDC) and student learning outcomes, providing valuable insights for
 main interventions.
- Overview of the planned training interventions (D2.1), done with a focus on different instructional designs as well as the alignment of the interventions with the research design and the cost-benefit framework.
- Research designs and instruments for data collection (D3.1), aimed to provide an overview of the various research designs and instruments for data collection applied in the pilot and intervention phase.
